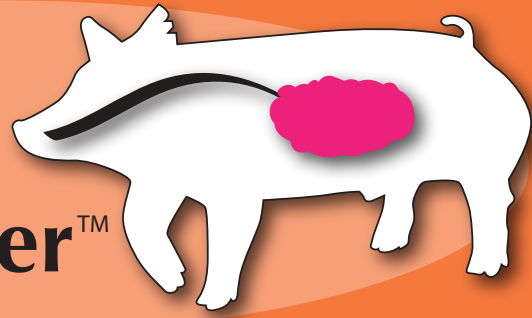

For Swine with Occasional Gastric Upset

All pigs are prone to occasional gastric upset, but pigs that are transported, co-mingled, suspect to heat stress and limit fed are more vulnerable.

- ▶ **A "Top Dress"**
 - For all classes of swine

- ▶ **Pigs experiencing gastric upset:**
 - Don't gain well
 - May lose weight and muscle

- ▶ **Signs your pigs have gastric upset:**
 - Loss of appetite or "off feed" - eat less and leave unfinished feed
 - Attitude changes - bad temperament, aggressiveness, cranky or nervous
 - Loss of body condition and muscle
 - Vomiting
 - Loose, dark stool
 - Pale color, rough hair coat

- ▶ **Contributing factors that may cause occasional gastric upset:**
 - Small particle size
 - Pelleting feed
 - High fat diets
 - Irregular feed shortages
 - Co-mingling of pigs
 - Exposure to new locations
 - Transportation
 - Fluctuating environmental temperatures

▶ Feed 1 scoop morning and night for pigs with occasional gastric upset, or 1 scoop per day for preventative maintenance.
